**Arrival in Scotland and Tour Departure:** This is a "land only" tour and begins on Monday, October 11, 2021. Travel arrangements prior to that are at your own discretion. Flights into Edinburgh/Glasgow from the US mostly arrive in the morning. There is no program on Day 1 until early evening when we meet for a welcome dinner. You may, of course, arrive a day or two early or choose to stay on after the tour.

### **Covid-19:**

We understand that you may have concerns about planning a trip when there is still so much uncertainty arising from the Covid-19 pandemic. At Scotus Tours, we are committed to the health and wellbeing of our guests. It is also very important to us to address any concerns our guests may have about cancellations in the current climate. As a result, we have introduced a new cancellation policy that will allow you to book with peace of mind:

### **Cancellation:**

If **we** cancel your tour at any point prior to the tour departure date, **we shall refund 100% of your tour fees.**

### **How Active is the Tour?**

We don't take long country hikes. We try to use hotels which have elevators and portage for luggage where possible. But you must be in good enough health to travel. Among other things you must be able to –

Stand or walk with our guides, inside and outdoors, sometimes in inclement weather; manage coach steps several times a day; manage your own luggage; climb stairs in some hotels; walk city streets (Edinburgh has some steep hills and steps).

## Our Itinerary

**Day 1: Monday, Oct 11 - Welcome to Scotland!** Group members will make their own flight arrangements. Arrive Edinburgh this morning. Spend the day as you wish in this lovely city and check in to your hotel. Meet your tour manager for an early evening welcome dinner. *Meals included – welcome dinner Overnight: Edinburgh City Center*

**Day 2: Tuesday, Oct 12 – Let's Go!** Our coach takes us to Glasgow. We visit Glasgow Cathedral and pause for a service of welcome – a short act of worship in the Celtic tradition. Our scenic route leads by Loch Lomond to the west coast port of Oban where we catch the ferry to the Isle of Mull. We arrive at our hotel, overlooking lovely Tobermory Bay, in time for dinner. *Meals included – breakfast, dinner Overnight: Tobermory, Isle of Mull*

**Day 3: Wednesday, Oct 13 – Iona...a Thin Place** We drive across the single track road to Fionnphort where another short ferry ride brings us to the Isle of Iona. It was here in the year 563 that St Columba arrived, establishing the Christian faith in this land. In Celtic spirituality Iona is sometimes described as a "thin place" – where the veil between earth and heaven seems almost transparent. We visit the Abbey, learn some of this island's history and hear about the Iona Community. We return to Tobermory for dinner. *Meals included – breakfast, dinner Overnight: Tobermory, Isle of Mull*

**Day 4: Thursday, Oct 14 – The Great Glen and Inverness** The morning ferry takes us back to the mainland. A distillery visit is on our agenda. And we'll pass by Glen Coe. We travel on through the beautiful scenery of the Great Glen and alongside Loch Ness. Near Inverness we'll visit the Culloden Battlefield where we can learn about Bonnie Prince Charlie and the Jacobites. *Meals included – breakfast Overnight: Nairn*

**Day 5: Friday, Oct 15 – I will lift mine eyes unto the hills** Turning south, we continue through the majesty of the Scottish Highlands. We'll find out what life used to be like here as we visit the Highland Folk Museum at Kingussie. Then on to Perth and St John's Kirk. John Knox preached here setting light to the Reformation in Scotland. Dinner tonight begins with a haggis ceremony complete with bagpipes and the poetry of Robert Burns. And, of course, you can taste a little. *Meals included – breakfast, dinner Overnight – Perth*

**Day 6: Saturday, Oct 16 – St Andrews...The Auld Grey Toon** The lovely town of St Andrews is just an hour from Perth. Famous for golf today, it has also been a place of pilgrimage and is an important site for Reformation history. One of our excellent guides will lead a walking tour. We return to Perth via the Tay Bridge and city of Dundee. *Meals included – breakfast, dinner Overnight – Perth*

**Day 7: Sunday, Oct 17 – Edinburgh, the Athens of the North** – We'll arrive in Edinburgh in time for morning worship with a Church of Scotland congregation. After lunch we'll have an orientation to Scotland's capital. Our guide will walk us among the medieval streets and will also explain much about modern living in this vibrant city. We see Greyfriars Kirk and hear about the Covenanters. The evening is free for you to choose dinner in one of Edinburgh's many eating places. *Meals included – breakfast Overnight – Edinburgh City Center*

**Day 8: Monday, Oct 18 – A Little More Edinburgh** Most of today is free for you to explore or do a little souvenir shopping. Maybe you'll want to visit the Castle or Holyrood Palace. Or you might want to relax over coffee and watch the city go by. Tonight we will share worship together and close with a celebration dinner. *Meals included – breakfast, celebration dinner Overnight – Edinburgh City Center*

**Day 9: Tuesday, Oct 19 – Departures after breakfast** Haste ye back!  
*Meals included – breakfast*
